# 20 great houses to rival Downton

From a castle for two in Durham to a Welsh manor for 18, Liz Bird picks the best historic houses to stay in

# For couples and families

### 1 Maiden's Tower Leeds Castle, Kent

After the day visitors have gone you'll have the 500-acre estate all to yourself when you stay in the 16th-century tower next to the moated castle, once home to Henry VIII. The house has five B&B rooms with sleigh beds, throws and sleek en suite bathrooms. Full English breakfast is served in the 17th-century oak-beamed barn overlooking the moat. Don't miss exploring the castle with its 73ft Henry VIII Banqueting Hall, resplendent with its heavily beamed ceiling and unusual ebony floor. Get lost



in the maze or try your hand at falconry.

# **2 Bradley House** Maiden Bradley, Wiltshire

This magnificent stately home is owned by descendants of the Tudor queen Jane Seymour; they are happy to give you a private tour. Three light and bright en suite bedrooms, some with wooden floors, period fireplaces and antiques, are in their own wing of the house. Have a full English breakfast or supper in the wood-panelled dining room, play croquet on the lawn or wander through the extensive garden and woodland.

Stonehenge, Glastonbury and the National Trust's Stourhead mansion and gardens are within easy reach.

# **3 Tullibole Castle** Kinross-shire

Lord and Lady Moncreiff preside over this 17th-century castle approached through woodland on a 260-acre estate. Ascend a spiral staircase to the Great Hall with its enormous log fire where you can take complimentary afternoon tea. The bedroom has wooden floors, antiques, fireplaces and shuttered windows and there's a separate private
